

VINCENT VAN GOGH

Dutch painter Vincent Van Gogh was born in 1853. Largely unknown during his lifetime, today he is recognised as one of the greatest painters of all time. Although he only lived until he was 37 years old, Van Gogh painted over 2,000 pieces during his lifetime. His art was part of the **Impressionist movement** and went on to inspire **Fauvism**.



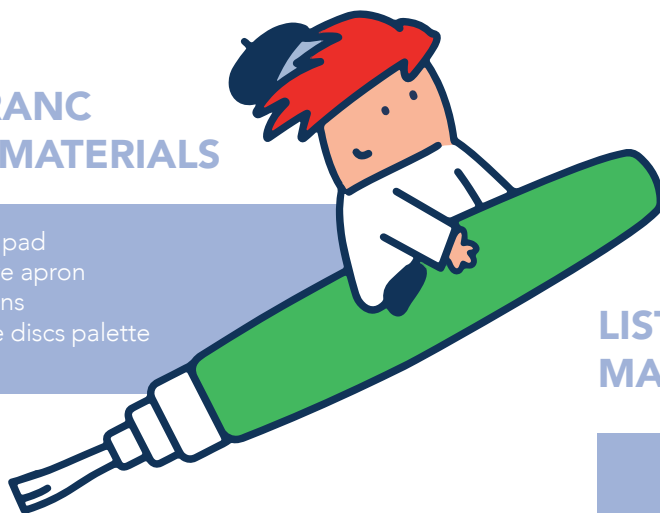
Vincent Van Gogh's paintings are **very recognisable**, thanks to how he worked with **light and colours**. He painted with bright colours like *Prussian and cobalt blue*, which he often contrasted against *yellow Cambodia*, which he often used to paint the sky.

LIST OF LEFRANC BOURGEOIS MATERIALS

- Drawing pad
- Protective apron
- Brush Pens
- Gouache discs palette
- Brushes



LIST OF OTHER MATERIALS

- The printed landscape
- A glass of water

STEP 1

Print the Vincent Van Gogh landscape (see below).

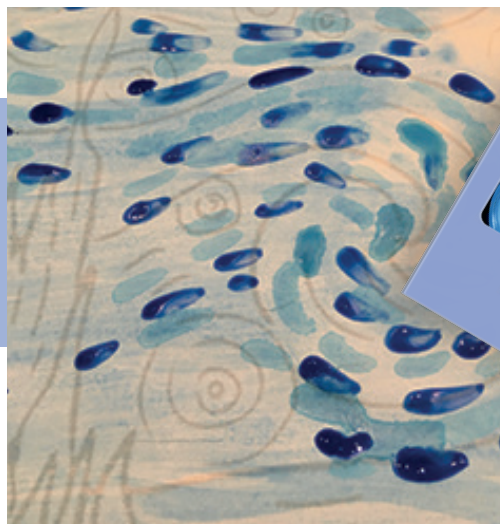
STEP 2

Prepare your gouache discs, a fine brush and a glass of water.



STEP 3

Paint the parts of the landscape that you want to colour and let your painting dry.





STEP 4

Using your brush pens, add more colour to your painting. Using small strokes, apply colourful patterns. These small strokes create the effect of movement, which you can emphasise using bright and dark versions of the same colour (e.g. light blue and dark blue).

STEP 5

Let your painting dry. Well done, it's ready to be exhibited!

Colour straight onto your drawing, creating small strokes with your Brush Pens!
